Lesson:

Native Species

A native species is an animal or plant that originated in that habitat due to natural progressions. Today, we focus on native reptiles in Florida. Some examples include: Alligators, Water Moccasin, Eastern Diamondback Rattlesnake.



Invasive Species

An invasive species is an animal or plant that did not originate in that habitat. Typically, it is an animal that thrives in its new environment and causes damage to that habitat. More times than not, invasive species outcompete native species. This is because invasive species usually do not have any natural predators in that new habitat. Some examples include: Iguanas, Burmese Pythons, Tegus, etc.
